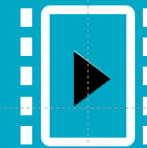

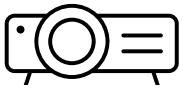

The WHO-ILO Policy Brief Launch Session – in a nutshell

- Lycias Zembe from UNAIDS provided context – situating this special webinar within the MENHT webinar series
- Cheryl Johnson from WHO provided an overall framing of the session during the opening remarks
- Mohammad Jamil for WHO provided the main elements of the policy brief then a panel discussion on the case studies mentioned in the policy brief, including India, Zimbabwe, Kenya.
 - The first part of the policy brief explains emerging experiences in the implementation of HIVST at workplace, using different case studies at country level.
 - The second part of the brief identifies financial approaches that could be used to support sustainability.
 - For this, the policy brief points out towards public financing mechanisms such as general governmental revenues and social and national health insurance and private financing, such as private health insurance and financial and in-kind support from company led workplace programmes.
 - The panel facilitated by Afsar from ILO discussed highlights and barriers on HIVST at workplaces and provided some insights on way forward in terms of sustainability of HIVST at workplaces.
