

- Men can access facility based as well as community-based models
 - we've seen that in the millions on VMMC, we have in other studies.
 - we need options of models including community-based models.
 - It is about Options, Design, Convenience and how benefits are perceived!



Avoid the usual traps



- New models should inspire new ways of doing things
- The more things change, the more they should not remain the same! We must evolve differently
- Shed the usual toga and skins that hold us back
 - Shed stigma
 - Shed vertical programs It's PrEP but also integrated HIV prevention and care
 - Shed the assumptions and narratives
 - Shed the segregation



It is less about the dots but more about connecting dots



- Easy to make different dots but the biggest challenge is connecting those dots
- Not so much about the destination but more about the path
 - · Let science and evidence lead the way
 - Simplify guideline communication
- Using the MENHT platform to connect dots, unearth best practices, promote uptake, building bridges from north to south


