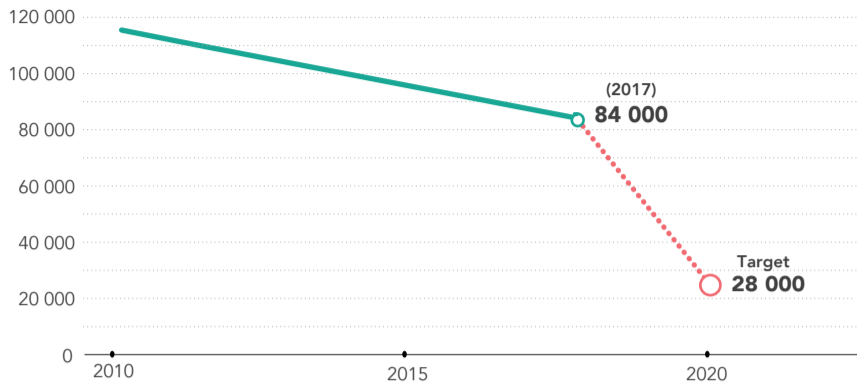


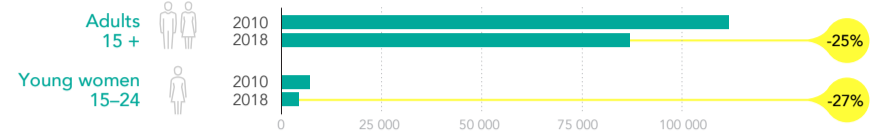
New HIV infections among adults aged 15+

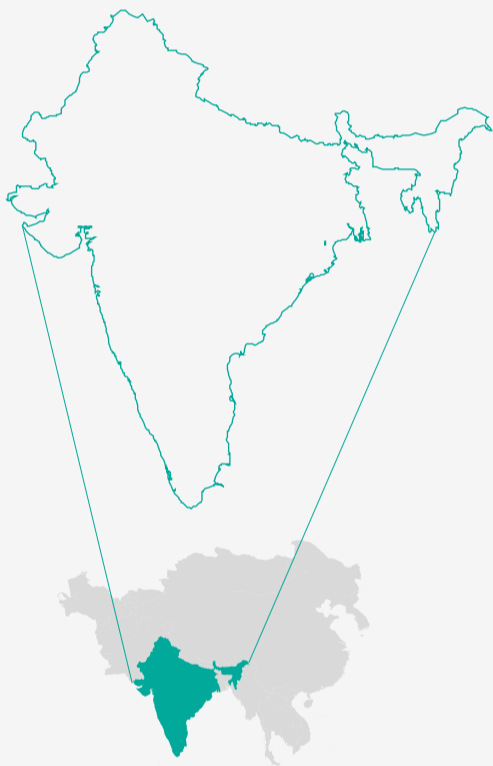
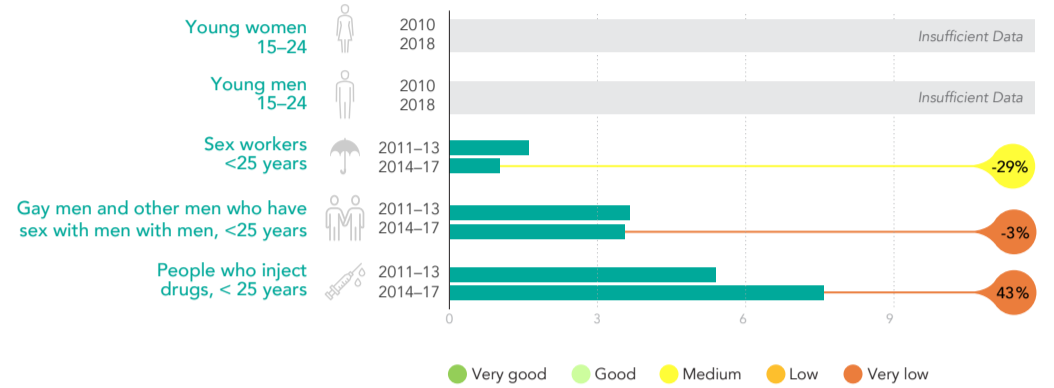


New HIV infections among adults declined by **25%** achieved through innovative approaches, strategies & tailored interventions among key populations and other groups at higher risk.

SEX WORKERS

Condom use at last paid sex (%)

Sex workers: 91 (Target: 95%)
Clients: 48

Received two interventions in past 3 months (%): 73%

Country messages: Sustained interventions among sex workers achieved increased condom use at last paid sex. A differentiated prevention package for effective service delivery is being implemented.

Score: 7

GAY MEN & OTHER MEN WHO HAVE SEX WITH MEN

Condom use at last anal sex (%)

Gay men and other men who have sex with men: 84 (Target: 90%)

Received two interventions in past 3 months (%): 59%

Country messages: Revision in population size estimate, hidden and hard-to-reach MSM especially on virtual spaces a challenge.

Score: 7

PEOPLE WHO INJECT DRUGS

Condom use at last paid sex (%)

With safe injections: 86 (Target: 95%)
On opioid substitution therapy: 20 (Target: 40%)

Received two interventions in past 3 months (%): 76%

Country messages: The focus of action is on harm reduction and scale-up of programmes including satellite OST centres.

Score: 8

PRE-EXPOSURE PROPHYLAXIS

700 Number of people who used oral pre-exposure prophylaxis at least once during the past 12 months

Composite pre-exposure prophylaxis preparedness score (0-10): 3

Country messages: The country is moving forward with a National Policy and Technical Guidelines on PrEP.

Score: 3

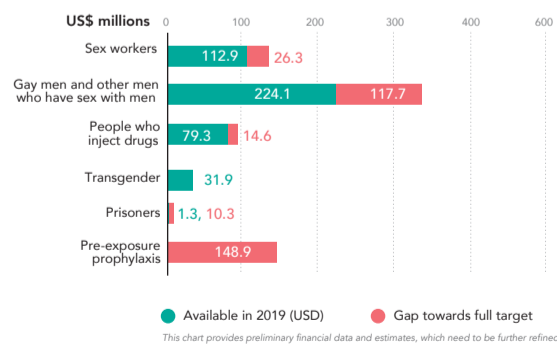
ANTIRETROVIRAL TREATMENT

Estimated HIV prevention financing and gaps

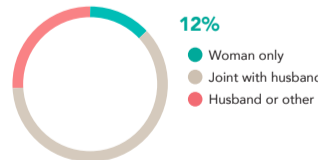

NEXT STEPS:

- > Sustain proportionate government funding.
- > Optimisation of human and financial resources.
